

REDUCE YOUR SUMMER WATER USE

WATER USE REDUCTION is on many gardeners' minds these days as we worry about the increasing cost of watering our plants. If you are interested in reducing your water bill, here are a number of things that you can do.

Fine tune your irrigation infrastructure

All of us have watched water run down the gutter due to spray heads that need adjustment. Take time regularly to run your irrigation system and check for leaks, broken or misaligned heads and proper distribution of water to plant roots. Carry out repairs as promptly as possible or hire someone who can. Consider shifting to "low flow" heads if feasible, which will deliver water more slowly, allowing for better soil absorption and less runoff.

Improve your soil

Many people are overwatering their landscapes by applying water more frequently than needed. Application of water once a week is adequate for all but the most water-loving species if your soil is good—a clay loam or sandy loam, which is common in the Central Valley. Where soils are heavy clay, or sandy as occurs in the San Joaquin Valley, consider amending with compost or other organic amendment to improve soil structure and allow better water penetration and retention. Keeping a layer of mulch on the surface will keep the soil cooler and conserve moisture, while also protecting the soil structure and slowing the loss of organic matter in the soil.

Reset your program

Adjust your watering program seasonally and turn it off when winter rains begin. Check your irrigation program run time making sure that it is set to shut off before wasteful runoff occurs. If needed, use repeating short water applications instead of one long one to allow time for all applied water to be absorbed into the soil.

Convert to low water plants

Consider replacing your high-water turf with drought-tolerant grass species or even removing it completely. Replace it with lower water-using ornamental grasses, perennials and ground covers. Surfacing materials like decomposed granite, stepping stones and concrete blocks can be used to create outdoor entertainment spaces that will not require irrigation in summer and allow winter rains to recharge the soil. Fall is the perfect time to make the change to a low-water landscape. Many of the plants and collections at the UC Davis Arboretum need water only every two weeks in summer once established. Visiting our gardens will help you see what plants you can use to create a lower-water landscape.

Check for rebates and services

Some water districts offer free inspections and advice such as the Sacramento Suburban Water Districts "Water-Wise House Call" Program. If you are unsure who your water service provider is, you can call the Regional Water Authority's "Be Water Smart" Hotline at: 1-888-WTR-TIPS (1-888-987-8477) for assistance.

UNDER CONSTRUCTION: CALIFORNIA NATIVE PLANT GATEWAY GARDEN TAKES SHAPE

AFTER THREE YEARS of careful design and planning, construction will start this summer on the new California Native Plant GATEway Garden at the east end of the Arboretum. The garden site is located between the railroad tracks and the east end of the Arboretum waterway, south of Aggie Village and the Davis Commons shopping center. Designed by Lutsko Associates and Cunningham Engineering, the garden will serve as an engaging destination with beautiful plantings and interpretive exhibits focused on the native plants of the lower Putah Creek Watershed. It will also provide a welcoming, accessible entry to the Arboretum from downtown Davis and the Davis Bike Loop.

The garden site will be fenced off and closed to visitors this summer as contractors work on the grading and hardscape, including new pathways, patios, a shade structure, lighting, benches, ornamental drainage features, and irrigation systems. The garden is part of the California Prop 84-funded Downtown Davis Parkway Greening Project, which also includes a portion of the Davis Commons parking lot and the adjacent Putah Creek Parkway greenbelt. All three sites will have construction activity this summer. Visitor detours will be well marked on site and the Arboretum website will have the latest information on detours and access.

After the dust has settled and the fences have come down, the real fun will begin this fall. Artist Chris Fennell will come in October to begin his month-long fabrication of a vine-inspired steel archway constructed of twisted metal pipes with shovel blade "leaves." Funded by the City of Davis, this sculp-



ture will highlight the connection between the garden site and downtown Davis. October will also mark the beginning of a series of community work parties to plant the garden. Interested in helping? Keep an eye out for email announcements about volunteer planting days.

Funding for the California Native Plant GATEway Garden is coming from the California Prop 84 Urban Greening Project Grant Program, UC Davis Campus Planning and Community Resources, the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services, the City of Davis Municipal Art Fund, the Stanley Smith Horticultural Trust, the T.S. PARTNERSHIP BRINGS INNOVATION TO UC DAVIS

JACK DANGERMOND, president and founder of Esri, one of the world's foremost GIS companies, visited campus on April 26 and invited our community to hear his vision about the future of GIS and launch a ground-breaking Esri-UC Davis pilot project. Dangermond is a longtime partner of the UC Davis Arboretum and supporter of the pioneering work Arboretum staff have completed to make geographic information systems (GIS) accessible to public gardens, parks and zoos all over the world.

Dangermond's passion for supporting conservation science combined with the Arboretum's GIS leadership, has led to Esri selecting UC Davis, and its Arboretum and Public Garden, as the site to build a suite of cloud-based mobile GIS tools to manage their organization and campus collections. The new tools that result from this work will be shared with botanical gardens and zoos around the world, to help them understand and protect the earth's biodiversity as well as educate their 50 million visitors about critical issues in conservation science.

The Arboretum's GIS leadership stems in large part from its staff securing over \$850,000 in grant funding over the course of ten years to create a suite of tools, data models, training materials, guides, and peer-to-peer support groups specifically for educating those involved with conservation about best practices for collecting and disseminating information about their collections.
